Noah Hoefs spent the first part of his career managing development and implementation of new facilities and programs for a nationally renowned medical transport company. Upon moving to Las Vegas, Noah made the transition into the role of Project for the construction Manager of two museum complexes, the Springs Preserve, which was the first LEED platinum campus in the

United States, and the Nevada State Museum. Noah was the Assistant Construction Manager on Southern Nevada Water Authority's Intake No. 3 and Low Lake Level Pump Station with an estimated cost of \$1.5 billion dollars. Noah has now engaged his knowledge and experience to help develop the future mode of transport: Hyperloop-One.





- President Michael Gordon presented the speaker with a "Sole Power" award and adjourned the meeting.








