MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Rotarians

Since 1985, Rotary has been at the forefront of eradicating polio around the world contributing more than \$1.7 billion and countless volunteer hours to immunize more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries.

Just last week, my son Samuel, received his polio vaccination and I'm proud to know that Rotary helped make it possible for him, and others like him, to never have to suffer from this paralyzing and potentially fatal disease.

Today, there are only three endemic countries: Afghanistan, Nigeria and Pakistan. Just 37 cases were confirmed worldwide in 2016, which dropped to 22 last year, and so far in 2018 there has only been 9 reported cases! We certainly are "this close" to eradicate only the second diseases ever – smallpox being the first.

For only \$0.60 you can help provide the necessary vaccines, transportation and materials needed in the fight against polio. Donate now, so that one day you can tell your children and grandchildren that you were part of the team that eradicated this horrible disease.
