## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT



### **OCTOBER 4, 2018**

The journey traveled by Mr. Frost was described in poignant detail, including bits of humor and determined organization, from his rescue from the accident site, to his hospitalization and rehabilitation, to his lessons learned, clearly made his audience reflect and provide inspirational insight. The 5 lessons learned, (1) nobody wants to take care of or work for 'a jerk'; (2) be the hope; (3) that things don't happen to you, but rather for you; (4) don't listen to 'they'; and (5) the two things you can control; your effort and your attitude are words to live by resonated with everyone in the room
- **President Jim** presented our speaker with a "Share What You Can" award to benefit a veteran in need and then adjourned the meeting.
