David Glenn Weismiller, MD, ScM, FAAFP is Professor of Family Medicine at the new medical school of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. An active clinician and educator, Dr. Weismiller provides full-scope care that includes inpatient care and maternity care.

He is a graduate of Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He completed his residency at the University of Virginia Health Sciences Center in Charlottesville and a fellowship in Maternal-Child Health and graduate degree

in Epidemiology at Brown University School of Medicine, Providence.

A proponent of "reflection in practice" and "learner-centered instruction," he is recognized internationally for his work in continuing medical education and faculty development. Having taught board review programs for the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) for more than 25 years, he is the founding and current chair of the AAFP Family Medicine Board Review ExpressTM, as well as the AAFP annual Family Medicine Update course. He is a frequent presenter at AAFP Family Medicine Experience and teaches American Board of Family Medicine Knowledge Self-Assessments throughout the country. Dr. Weismiller is the author of numerous publications on issues related to women's and children's health, and he is an advocate for empowering individuals to make sound health care choices. He was recognized in 2018 as a "Best Doctor" in Desert Comnpanion's Annual List.

On a personal front, David is an avid fan of the performing arts. His love of music and theater is lifelong. One of his other favorite avocations is presidential history. Born and raised in our nation's capital, he is on a venture to visit all of the libraries of our US Presidents of the past 120 years.

David lives in Henderson with his partner Brian DeLong. They have three amazing adult daughters Hillary, Meredith, and Bronwyn.



MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT




