

The Wheelchair Foundation and The Rotary Club Of Las Vegas have one again renewed their 20-year relationship of teaming up to provide wheelchairs for those in need in Southern Nevada.

In 2001, during Jim Hunt's term as President of The Las Vegas Rotary Club, the organization held a fundraiser to purchase 110 Wheelchairs with The Wheelchair Foundation. Through public service announcements, disabled Southern Nevadan's in need of a new chair were identified and Rotarians from the Las Vegas Club made deliveries to all 110 recipients.

Now, in need of assistance to deliver even more chairs, John Williams of the Wheelchair foundation recently reached out to Hunt who has again formed a Las Vegas Rotary Club Wheelchair Delivery Team. Assisting him in the deliveries are Rotarians Russ Swain, Howie Hopkinson, Brock Frasier and Randy Donald.

At a time when there are those who are in more need of help than ever before, Rotarians and the Wheelchair Foundation are stepping up to the plate to ensure the freedom of mobility to recipients who have permanent disabilities and cannot afford a new chair.

Hunt reports that for him, and the members of the Rotarian team, personally delivering the Wheelchairs has been a humbling and spiritually rewarding experience that has warmed the hearts of everyone concerned.

The only requirements to be eligible for a brand new, lightweight, fire engine red wheelchair from The Wheelchair Foundation and The Rotary Club Of Las Vegas NV are:

1. Must Be A Nevada Resident
2. Must Have A Permanent Disability
3. Cannont Afford A New Wheelchair (Documentation Not Required)
