

Glara Byrne Green Our Planet



In March, 2013 Ciara Byrne and Kim MacQuarrie co-founded a non-profit called Green Our Planet based in Las Vegas that runs one of the largest and most comprehensive STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) school garden programs in the United States. The mission is to increase student academic performance in STEAM through project-based education, which includes nutrition, financial literacy, and conservation education in PreK-12 schools. Green Our Planet has impacted more than 140,000 students across the United States and works with more than 5,000 teachers. Over the past seven years Green Our Planet has built 200 school gardens, helped organize over 800 student-run farmers market, over 600 chef demos, trained over 3000 teachers to use the Green Our Planet STEAM curriculum and implemented a hydroponics program at 75 schools from New York and Florida to Alaska and Montana. Before running Green Our Planet, Ciara ran a film production company called Lion Television with offices in New York and LA and made films all over the world for channels including PBS, BBC, TLC, Discovery Channel, National Geographic and more. Ciara was selected along with 19 other nonprofit leaders from around the world, from 5,000 applications to be a 2019 Obama Fellow.





ROTARY FOUNDATION REPORT

2020 was undoubtedly one of the most challenging years for rotarians around the world, and certainly for the entire global community. As rotarians, we are people of action, we make a difference by serving others through our time, talent and treasure. With all the financial and general challenges facing club members, the Las Vegas Rotary Club showed its generosity transcends circumstances through giving to the Rotary International Foundation (TRF).

For the current rotary year to date, over 73% of our club members made a contribution in support of RI through TRF, with over 38% contributing as sustaining members. Our Club contributed \$16,586 in this rotary year to the PolioPlus campaign to eradicate polio. This contribution and more from Rotarians around the globe led to the eradication of polio in Africa, with Afghanistan and Pakistan remaining as the only two countries in the world with active cases of polio.

At the beginning of the current rotary year, our goal was to contribute \$25,000 to the RI Annual fund. By December 2020, our club had contributed \$12,625. As of January 6th, our Club's all time giving to TRF stands at \$1.725M.

Global Grants

Under the leadership of past president Karen Whisenhunt, the Club partnered with the Rotary Club of Poltova, Ukraine to secure a global grant that will fund comprehensive rehabilitation programs for children with autistic spectrum disorders in Ukraine.

The Las Vegas Rotary Club is the greatest rotary club in the world because it cares about the people and community it serves, locally and globally. Our ongoing support of TRF is a living testament of that spirit of giving that embodies this club.
