





So, what is Corporate Membership? Corporate Membership allows a Club to involve a corporation – or any business, nonprofit, or government entity – in Rotary by offering an alternative membership package to some of its employees. According to our By-Laws, Corporate Membership is by Board invitation only for CEO's, CFO's, upper management or heads of Government Agencies who cannot meet Rotary attendance requirements. Corporate members designate a limited number of alternate employees within the Company or Agency to regularly attend meetings and represent the Company or Agency at Rotary activities when the Corporate Member is unable to attend. Corporate Membership is beneficial to both the corporation and our Club. The chart below identifies those benefits.
