MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

This week started with Independence Day, marking the anniversary of the Second Continental Congress adopting the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. The Congress, made up of delegates from the United States' original 13 colonies, unanimously approved the document that declared independence from Great Britain.

Thomas Jefferson and four other members of the Second Continental Congress were tasked with drafting a declaration that was signed by 56 men

These 56 men were not wild eyed, rabble-rousing ruffians. They were men of means and education-they had security, but they valued liberty more. Together they pledged: "For the support of this declaration, with firm reliance on the protection of the divine providence, we mutually pledge to each other, our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor."

These men were more concerned with future generations than themselves. In 1911, at the second Rotary convention in Portland, Oregon, the motto "Service above Self" was conceived. At the 1950 Rotary International Convention in Detroit, Michigan, the slogan "Service above Self" was formally approved along with "He Profits Most Who Serves Best." The 1989 Rotary Council on Legislation established "Service Above Self" as the primary motto of Rotary because it best conveys the Rotary philosophy of unselfish volunteer service.

In the last two weeks, we have lost two wonderful ladies, Joan Murdock and Kathy Dalvey. In the last two years we have lost many more good Rotarians including Ty Hilbrecht, Janet Linder, Kazem Fathie, Paul Kellogg, and Steve Kasbeer. These Rotarians were all committed to "Service Above Self."

Author, philosopher and religious leader, Sterling W. Sill said, "Two of the most important events in life are birth and death. And what a thrilling thing it is to be well born . . . but it may be even more important to die well." We die well by leaving a trail of service and sacrifice that has blessed the lives of those around us.

We can't control the circumstances in which we are born, but we can control the life we lead and the service we give.

We remember our founding fathers because of their service and sacrifice in establishing this great country and we remember the great Rotarians before us for their examples of Service Above Self.


