#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

This week we celebrate Nevada Admissions day.

In the early 1860s, Nevada was a wealthy state and getting wealthier. The federal government bought much of Nevada's silver and gold bullion to support its currency and mint coins. For the first time, western mining began to attract investments from large eastern capitalists, and these powerful men began to push for Nevada statehood.

At the time, the Nevada Territory was a federal territory, a part of the Union, and President Abraham Lincoln appointed Gov. James Warren Nye, a former police commissioner in New York City, to ensure that it stayed that way. Gov. Nye put down any demonstration in support of the Confederacy, and there were some.

By March, 1864, the Civil War was winding down. The Union had won decisive victories at Gettysburg and Vicksburg, and the South was in shambles.

President Lincoln sought reelection and faced a three-way race against Gen. John C. Fremont, the radical Republican candidate who had run for the presidency and lost to James Buchanan in 1856 and Gen. George B. McClellan, a Democrat.

The time was ripe to make Nevada a state. Local leadership agreed. Since time was so short, the Nevada constitutional delegation sent the longest telegram on record up to that time to Washington, D.C., containing the entire text of the proposed state constitution and costing the then astronomical sum of \$3,416.77.

On October 31, 1864, anxious to have support of the Republican-dominated Nevada Territory for President Abraham Lincoln's reelection, the U.S. Congress quickly admits Nevada as the 36th state in the Union. Nevada was allowed to become a state with a population of 42,941 much fewer than the 60,000 residents that were usually required.

Nevada became one of the "Battle Born" states because of its entrance into the Union during the Civil War. Nevada had an opportunity and took it. It became a state more than 25 years before Washington, Idaho, Wyoming, Utah, New Mexico or Arizona.

For most of my life Nevada has been the fastest growing state in the country. Since the 1930s, Nevada has been one of the fastest growing states. When I was born in 1961, the state had 315,000 residents and Clark County had 135,000 residents.

People come here for the opportunity our community provides. People join Rotary for the opportunities of fellowship and service. Like Nevada, let's make the most of our opportunities and continue to build a wonderful community!


