Shah's dedicated marketing trajectory began in 2000 as an undergraduate communications student at the University of

Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV). A full-time student, Shah worked as an unpaid intern at the Tom and Nicole Morning show on Clear Channel Radio Station KSNE-FM (Sunny 106.5) in Las Vegas where he helped the station produce morning show segments. He later became the Sales/Executive Assistant for Clear Channel Radio, where he planned promotions and compiled the station budget.

In 2004, Shah joined Cox Media where he organized the COX/ESPN Sports Memorabilia Tour and the NFL Network Kickoff Party. In addition, Shad revamped the A Welcome Home, a program designed to find homes for foster children. As a result, Shah was honored with the Adoption Excellence Award by the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services in 2005.

In 2007, Shah graduated with a Masters of Business Administration from the University of Southern Nevada (USN) – now known as Roseman University of Health Sciences. Shah also served as Director of Online Marketing at Zen Entertainment and Nevada State Bank where he drove \$2.5M worth of revenue from online channels.

A firm believer in giving back to the community, Shah has volunteered with the Andre Agassi Foundation, the Tiger Woods Foundation and Olive Crest. Shah also serves as an adjunct professor at the UNLV Lee Business School. He has also served on the board of directors for the American Advertising Federation – Las Vegas and led the 200 member organization as Governor for the District.

In his ten years of teaching higher education, Shah still finds himself learning from others. "Whether it's the latest marketing trends or understanding current campaigns, I'm always learning from my students," said Shah.

When he's not working or volunteering his time, Shah enjoys hitting the gym, watching news satire TV, and indulging in the Las Vegas culinary scene with his wife.







ARE WE RELATED?

Have you ever sat in a room full of people and wondered if or how you might be related to those around you?

Relatives around Me, a fun feature in the FamilySearch FamilyTree app, can tell you how you are related to friends, neighbors, or anyone sitting near you.

Do you know there's a good chance you are related to another member of the Las Vegas Rotary Club? Some of our board members have tried the app only to find they are fifth, sixth or eleventh cousins with others board members.



Family Tree

In January, we will be doing a program on Genealogy and Family History. To make it most effective, we need our members to do two things.

First, download the free app at the Google store or the Apple app store.

Second, look for your parents or grandparents using the app. You probably need to know their birth date and birth place. Once a few of your grandparents are in the app then you'll start getting hints. Build your tree as far as it is convenient. While you are visiting family during the holidays,

Once you go back to the 1940s or earlier, a lot of the research is easier since older data is regularly published by the government. For example, all of the census data from 1940 or earlier is available to the public and is in the FamilySearch app.

When you have that information in the app, it has a feature called "Relatives around Me." This fun feature in the FamilySearch Family Tree app, can tell you how you are related to friends, neighbors, or anyone sitting near you.

To try **Relatives around Me**, you and your potential cousin both need to be signed in to the Family Tree app and within approximately 100 feet of each other.

When you are in a room with others that have their Family Tree App open, you "Scan for Friends." Within seconds it will show you all the cousins you have in the room. Selecting the person's name will bring up a pedigree graphic showing your common ancestor and the lines through which you both descend. Pretty cool, right?



In addition, you can also find how you are related to famous people, like presidents, actors, athletes, historic figures, European royalty and more.

So download the app and search for your grandparents. We will give a brief demonstration in the meeting today.


