MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

This last week was a fantastic time for football fans. Many of the NFL games were exciting to the end. College football had its national championship with perennial champion Alabama playing its SEC nemesis Georgia. The game got better as it progressed. Ultimately, Georgia beat Bama and won its first national title in 41 years.

Most sports fans love to follow the scores and stats, the wins and losses. But if sports were only about numbers and rankings, they probably wouldn't fascinate us the way they do. Behind the scores and jerseys are people we come to care about and inspirational stories that teach us important life lessons.

We see some athletes who are clearly gifted and seem to have advantages from the start. Alabama and Georgia continually recruit the most talented athletes in the nation. But Georgia's victory wasn't led by a highly recruited player or a physical specimen. The hero of the game was a walk on with a 5-foot-11, 190-pound frame, Stetson Bennett, who came to Georgia without a scholarship. He was on the team his first year and then transferred to a junior college. He came back because, as a Georgia native, he grew up dreaming of playing for the Bulldogs. This year, due to an injury to the starting quarterback, he became the starter and known for his blue-collar work ethic.

We see athletes like Bennett who aren't the strongest or fastest but who excel because of their will, tenacity, and hard work. We enjoy stories of athletes who are resilient, who fail and then bounce back, overcoming difficulties.

Among sports' life lessons are that perseverance, hard work and commitment win the day, no matter the final score. Our most satisfying victories come when we overcome challenges by simply refusing to give up.

In the game of life, idleness, pride and pessimism face off against determination, selflessness and hope. The association with Rotary provides us with a great group of individuals that are examples of success and friends that help us when we are down.

What we are doing in our community is impactful, and we need everyone to help in any manner they can. We must set goals to help and follow through on these commitments to reach our full potential.

Another way is to update your will or estate plan to include the Las Vegas Rotary Foundation.

Make the Las Vegas Rotary Foundation at least a one percent (1%) beneficiary of just one of these accounts or policies, and return the form to your institution.



ARE WE RELATED?

Have you ever sat in a room full of people and wondered if or how you might be related to those around you?

Relatives around Me, a fun feature in the FamilySearch FamilyTree app, can tell you how you are related to friends, neighbors, or anyone sitting near you.

Do you know there's a good chance you are related to another member of the Las Vegas Rotary Club? Some of our board members have tried the app only to find they are fifth, sixth or eleventh cousins with others board members.



Family Tree

In January, we will be doing a program on Genealogy and Family History. To make it most effective, we need our members to do two things.

First, download the free app at the Google store or the Apple app store.

Second, look for your parents or grandparents using the app. You probably need to know their birth date and birth place. Once a few of your grandparents are in the app then you'll start getting hints. Build your tree as far as it is convenient. While you are visiting family during the holidays,

Once you go back to the 1940s or earlier, a lot of the research is easier since older data is regularly published by the government. For example, all of the census data from 1940 or earlier is available to the public and is in the FamilySearch app.

When you have that information in the app, it has a feature called "Relatives around Me." This fun feature in the FamilySearch Family Tree app, can tell you how you are related to friends, neighbors, or anyone sitting near you.

To try **Relatives around Me**, you and your potential cousin both need to be signed in to the Family Tree app and within approximately 100 feet of each other.

When you are in a room with others that have their Family Tree App open, you "Scan for Friends." Within seconds it will show you all the cousins you have in the room. Selecting the person's name will bring up a pedigree graphic showing your common ancestor and the lines through which you both descend. Pretty cool, right?



In addition, you can also find how you are related to famous people, like presidents, actors, athletes, historic figures, European royalty and more.

So download the app and search for your grandparents. We will give a brief demonstration in the meeting today.


